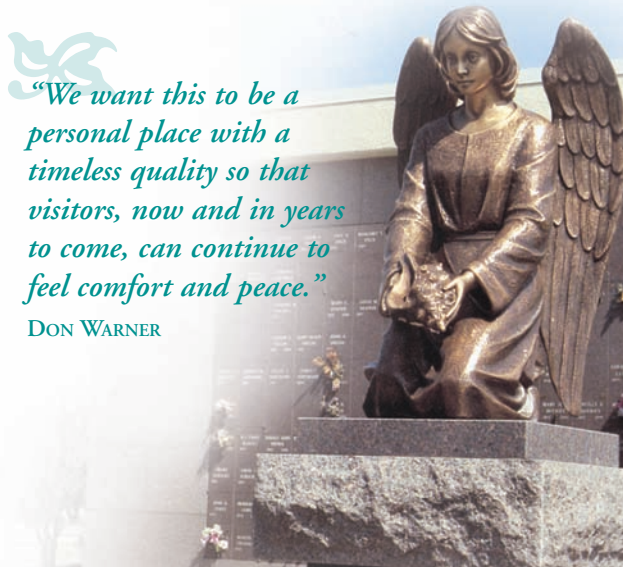


## Remembering a beloved child

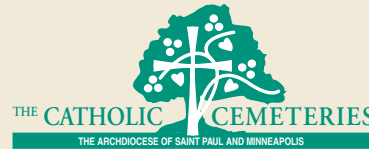

## Visit the Children's Memorial and Prayer Garden

The Children's Memorial and Prayer Garden is nestled in a pine tree grove just outside Gethsemane Cemetery's Chapel Mausoleum. Granite benches surround a pool and fountain with large rocks and a bronze dolphin family emerging from the water, inspired by Angela Warner's lifelong love of dolphins and the ocean.

Around the pool are features that invite pause and reflection. An image of Jesus and a child is etched on a granite wall, along with a poem written by the Warners in memory of their daughter, entitled "Lament for a Child." Three bronze angels, created by Italian sculptor Guido Mariani, celebrate God's many blessings and promise of eternal life.

The Memorial offers an opportunity for families to memorialize a child of any age. Paving bricks that border the walkway leading to the Memorial are available for inscription of the child's name and years of birth and death.

## Memorialization Opportunity

Bereaved parents are invited to memorialize a child's name on paving bricks that border the walkway leading to the Children's Memorial and Prayer Garden at Gethsemane Cemetery. A contribution of \$250 covers the cost of the memorial brick and inscription and supports the endowment for the care and maintenance of the Memorial.
